
#### **BIOGRAPHY OF**

## MILLARD C. PICKERING

GRAND EXALTED RULER
2013–2014

Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the U.S.A.





**M**illard C. Pickering was initiated into Bristow, Oklahoma, Lodge No. 1614 in 1976 and was appointed Tiler at the next meeting. He served as Esteemed Loyal Knight before relocating to Branson, Missouri. He joined a committee there to institute a new Lodge and was installed as Charter Loyal Knight of Lake Taneycomo Lodge No. 2597 in 1980. He served as Exalted Ruler in 1981–1982 before returning to Oklahoma to attend the University of Tulsa, College of Law.

As a member of Sapulpa, Oklahoma Lodge No. 1118, he served as Secretary and President of the P.E.R. Association, Chaired the Auditing, Indoctrination, Government Relations, Drug Awareness, Membership, and National Foundation Committees. As a two-term Member and Chairman of the Lodge Trustees, he presided over the design and construction of Centennial Hall to commemorate the Lodge's one-hundredth year anniversary.

He has served the Oklahoma Elks Association in numerous positions including Chairman of the Laws and Resolutions Committee for over ten years, State Parliamentarian, Northeast District Vice-President, and State President in 2009–2010.

He was appointed District Deputy in 2001–2002 and worked on the Grand Lodge Committee on Judiciary for eight years, including two years as Chairman, on the Grand Lodge Resolutions Committee for three years, the last as Chairman, on the Grand Lodge Pardon Commission for three years, and as a Justice of the Grand Forum for five years, completing his term as Chief Justice.

He holds a Baccalaureate Degree from the College of the Ozarks and a Juris Doctorate Degree from the University of Tulsa, where he received the American Jurisprudence Award, the Order of the Barrister, and was a member of Phi Delta Phi Honor Fraternity.

Millard was appointed Assistant District Attorney in several jurisdictions, Assistant Attorney General, Staff Attorney to the Oklahoma Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training and has coordinated the Criminal Justice and Law Enforcement programs at Tulsa Community College, Oklahoma's third largest college, since 1997. He served as legal instructor to the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Academy, Tulsa Police Academy, Oklahoma Police Corp, and many prosecution and law enforcement agencies around the country. He was named Oklahoma Prosecutor of the Year in 1991.

He has held five commissions in Law Enforcement and is a past president of the Association of Oklahoma Narcotic Enforcers and a Charter Member and former Sub-Committee Chairman of the National Narcotic Officer's Associations Coalition, where he met with members of Congress in support of drug enforcement efforts.

He enjoys an active lifestyle with many diverse interests including aviation, martial arts, cooking, travel, mixology, and cross-country motorcycling. He has ridden motorcycles in all fifty of the United States and is a Life Member of Harley Owners Group, acting as subject matter expert for that organization's officer training classes for a number of years.

He is an accomplished vocalist, and has performed with many groups in various locations including Branson, Missouri, and the Tulsa Performing Arts Center. He has been cast in over thirty performances of Tulsa Opera and served as president of that organization for two years.

Millard and his devoted wife, Susanne, a Collegiate Academic Counselor of many years, have been married since 1989, and are members of the Church of St. Mary in Tulsa, Oklahoma, where Millard is a Charter member of the local Knights of Columbus Council. They are proud Godparents to two nieces and a nephew.

Paul exhibits one of the traits of good leadership by warning the people of Ephesus about the tough times that are to come. They (Ephesians) are up against Satan himself, an enemy who will do everything to stop their progress.

To help allay their fears, Paul lays out a specific plan for his friends in Ephesus. They are not to approach this enemy with their own strength, but remembering that with God on their side they can defeat this foe. Paul then

instructs his friends to put on the whole armor of God so they may stand and prevail. Paul (serving as an officer under God) issues orders to his troops.

When leaders practice the Law of Intuition, they provide their people with:



#### Heroin



The Bugle editor, Ken Johnson, asked me to write a series of informative articles about drug and alcohol abuse. I am not an expert on this subject, but have been with the Two Rivers Police Department for 28 years and currently hold the rank of Patrol Lieutenant.

Heroin is an opiate, a class of drugs that are either naturally derived from the flowers of the poppy plant, or synthetic substitutes. In the case of heroin, it's produced from morphine, a naturally occurring substance that comes from the seedpod of poppy plants. All opiate abuse, including heroin and many prescriptions painkillers carries a strong risk of addiction and physical dependence. Heroin is abused by injecting, snorting or smoking it, and all three can cause the same level of addiction, as well as serious health problems and even death.

Heroin enters the brain very quickly, making it particularly addictive. It's estimated that almost one-fourth of the people who try heroin become addicted. And over time, heroin users develop a tolerance, meaning that more and more of the drug is needed to achieve the same results.1

According to The Wisconsin State Crime Lab around 350 heroin submissions were processed in 2009. Then, just three years later, in 2012, that number nearly doubled.

Heroin overdose deaths are on the rise across Wisconsin. Last year alone, heroin deaths climbed by 50 percent. Drug use has spread from inner cities like Chicago across state lines. Heroin is infiltrating many of Wisconsin's suburban communities and rural areas at alarming rates.<sup>2</sup>

Heroin which was once prevalent in the 60's and 70's, has made a vicious and deadly come back.
