Mike has been employed in the banking industry for the last 44 years in both a regulatory capacity for the Massachusetts Office of the Commissioner of banks and the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation and as a banker holding the positions of Treasurer, Chief Financial Officer, and is currently serving as Vice President and Community Reinvestment Officer of North Shore Bank.



He served on numerous committees including the House Committee, and he has been recognized a number of times for his service to the Lodge, including being named Officer of the Year and Elk of the Year, and having been awarded Honorary Life membership. He remains very active in the Lodge.

At the State Level he has served as a Director of the Massachusetts Elks Scholarship Fund, State Treasurer 1984-1992, State President 1995-1996, State Charity Advisory Committee 1986-present, State Convention Chairman 1997-2007, State President's Advisory Committee 1996-present, Chairman of the Grand Exalted Ruler's reception for many years and was selected Massachusetts State Elk of the Year in 1997-1998.

At the Grand Lodge level, he served as District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler of the Massachusetts East District in 1983-1984, Area Special Representative of Massachusetts Area 3 in 1996-2002, Grand Lodge Committeeman on Lodge Activities/State Associations in 1998-2000, Area 1 Representative on the Board of Grand Trustees from 2010-2014, having served as Secretary of the Board from 2010-2013 and Vice Chairman in 2014, and Special Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler 2007-present.

Mike and his wife Donna (Norcott) have been married for 45 years and have four daughters: Jennifer, Susan, Michele and Amy, all of whom are Members of the Saugus-Everett Lodge of Elks No. 642. Their daughter Jennifer is a Past Exalted Ruler. Donna is also active in the Lodge and serves as a Member of the Board of Trustees. Mike and Donna are also blessed to have three grandsons: Joseph, Nicholas and Michael.

To My Fellow Elks:

We are just getting our year going as President-Elect and First Lady-Elect and are really enjoying going to the different Lodges and meeting our fellow Elks. It is such a wonderful experience to talk to the different people and get differing points of view. We also like to capitalize on the good ideas that the different Lodges present. We like to take these ideas back to our Lodge and try to implement

them. Also, we can discuss the good ideas with the different Lodges we visit in the hope that maybe it will fit into their agendas.

As President-Elect I am asked to talk to the Lodges about our three charities: (1) Elks National Foundation (2) Wisconsin Benevolent Fund and (3) State Major Project. One of my main points is to get the main population interested.

The Elks National Foundation is a fund that when we donate money to it the principle of the fund is never spent. But the money is invested and the interest and earnings from it are distributed to the states and to the grants and scholarships available to the Lodges. For every dollar we donate to it, we get about three dollars back in the form of grants, scholar-

ships and great programs for our youth and communities.

The Wisconsin Benevolent Fund was started to mirror the Elks National Foundation and it only distributes what it earns – not the principle. It is a major part of our budget and helps to finance our programs.

The State Major Project is the Elks Village Respite Center in Wisconsin Dells. This is a 48 bed unit offering one-on-one 24/7 care to disabled individuals age 3 to adult who need this type of care. We offer week-long and weekend programs. In 24 years we have provided respite care for over 11,000 individuals. Anybody can visit the camp to see what it does. It is a worthwhile project.

As we continue to visit the Lodges I will be happy to talk to anyone. If you have something your Lodge has done in the community and you are proud of it, please tell me, and as President Rob says, "Be Proud and Be Loud".
