STATE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE


Members and Friends,

STATE CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE

33 Saul said to David, 'you cannot go and fight the Philistine; you are only a boy and he has been a warrior since his youth.' -- David said to Saul, ³⁶ Your servant has killed both lion and bear, and this uncircumcised Philistine will end up like one of them for having challenged the armies of the living God.' 1 Samuel 17: 33, 36 New Jerusalem Bible

Sometimes people in leadership positions forget to look at the strengths of those they work with. It seems to be "human nature" to look at someone's weaknesses rather than their strengths. Perhaps it is easier to assess alleged problems or shortcomings than the individual's positive abilities.

If one is in a leadership position and focuses solely on correcting perceived weaknesses in an individual, the result is a



demoralized and an unwilling subordinate. I am sure that many of us have experienced a supervisor that underestimated the "worth" of yourself or others in their group.

It takes time to learn the strengths and weaknesses, likes and dislikes of those assigned to us. It is hard to ask the simple question – "what gives you the most enjoyment, or feeling of satisfaction?"

Perhaps if Saul had asked David a variant of the above question he would have learned more about David's abilities. As it was, David defended himself and convinced Saul that he was up to the task.

If you are in a leadership position, consider the following:

- Learn what you can about the people in your charge -- ask questions!
- When possible place people in tasks that they enjoy or are willing to learn
- Focus on an individual's strengths, not shortcomings
- Help sharpen skills that already exist
- Compliment their positive qualities bring out the gifts inherent to the person
- Let the weaknesses wait- unless they are character flaws

Those who occupy leadership positions within our lodges should be searching for their replacement. This identification process may or not be an easy task, yet a it is task that should be addressed early.

No one person is "perfect" (I certainly am not) and their skills may or may not meet accepted norms. Please try to remember that only after a strong rapport is established and the person begins to grow and gain confidence should one address the areas of weakness. These "weaknesses" must be handled gently and one at a time so - take your time!

Patience is virtue, too!

GRANT FORMULAS

Following are the formulas, along with Wisconsin's prior-year and cumulative figures, used to calculate the Special Projects, State Charities and Bonus Grants that are received from the Elks National Foundation. These funds are then used as decided by the Wisconsin Elks to fund their charitable accounts as decided by the budget process.

Special Projects Grant

Special Project Grants are awarded in June. The annual grant amount to each state is determined with the following formula.

Variables:

- G=State's Grant Amount
- SC=State's Cumulative Donations to ENF (\$7,312,938.71)
- TC=Total Cumulative Donations from all states (\$206,427,221.98)
- GP=Grant Pool (\$2,896,380)
- G=(SC/TC) x GP

Wisconsin State Elks Association

\$102,610 = (7,312,938.71/206,427,221.98) x 2,896,380

State Charities Grand and Bonus Grant

State Charities Grants are awarded in late August. When in a position to do so, the Board of Trustees also awards a Bonus Grant. The ENF uses the same formula to calculate State Charities Grants and Bonus Grants.

Variables:

G=State's Grant Amount

SC=State's Cumulative Donations to ENF (\$7,312,938.71)

TC=Total Cumulative Donations from all states (\$206,427,221.98)

TG=Total Grant Pool (SC \$3,902,100/Bonus \$1,000,000)

SP=State's Prior Year Donations (excluding bequests (\$69,072.05)

SB=State's Prior Year Bequests (\$0.00)

TP=Total Prior Year Donations from all states (excluding bequests) (\$5,878,744.22)

TB=Total Prior Year Bequests from all states (\$1,095,508.93)

 $G=((SC/TC) \times 0.3TG) + ((SP/TP) \times 0.65TG) + ((SB/TB) \times 0.05TG)$

\$71,050 = ((7,312,938.71/206,427,221.98) x 117,063) + (69,072.05/5,878,744.22) x 2,536,365) + (0.00) **\$18,270** = ((7,312,938.71/206,427,221.98) x 300,000) + (69,072.05/5,878,744.22) x 650,000) + (0.00)

Based on these formulas, in 2012-13, the WEA will receive **\$191,930** total in State and Bonus Grant funds. Note, the Special Projects grant is based on cumulative giving, not just last year. For the State Charities and Bonus Grants, 30 percent of the grant is based on cumulative giving. That's why the returns vary.

The Elks National Foundation strives to grant more money back to each state than it received from that state in donations. We are pleased this is true for the Wisconsin Elks.


