

Chapter 1: Birth of the Association

The early records of the Wisconsin Elks Association are quite sketchy, but there are enough facts available to assure that our association was the brainchild of M.E. Dillon, Past Exalted Ruler of the Ashland Elks. He proposed that the association have its organizational meeting in Ashland Lodge on April 21-23, 1902. The Secretary of the Ashland Lodge sent out the invitations.

The attendees at the April, 1902 organizational meeting were:

Stevens Point Lodge 641: M. Clifford Waukesha Lodge 400: A. F. Warden

West Superior Lodge 403: W. M Trumbell and J. L. Malone

(Note: Throughout this book, we use Lodge names and numbers which existed at the point in time.)

Thus eleven of the 28 lodges then chartered in Wisconsin were represented at this meeting. This is remarkable when one considers the primitive nature of transportation at that time. Although it had been a state for over 50 years, Wisconsin had almost no paved roads between its cities. City-to-city transportation was completely dependent on horses, oxcarts or on steam locomotives powered by coal or wood, while the best "highway" in Wisconsin was a planked road stretching from "downtown" Milwaukee westward.

What makes this meeting even more remarkable is the nature of risk taken by each of its delegates. The Grand Lodge did not, at this time, encourage the creation of state associations. In fact, the question of whether state associations should be banned was before the Grand Lodge until 1907, when they were finally sanctioned. Not until 1916, however, was the G/L Constitution amended to allow such associations to exist. Thus the Elks at the Ashland Conference not only endured difficult travel, they also had no assurance that what they were creating had any probability of survival.




