Meeting started late as vice chair Aaron Holbrook arrived a few minutes late.
There was discussion of current lodge standings and donations. All but one lodge had made GER per capita goal of \$4.80 per member and the state stood at \$13.56 per member. Donations for this year must be RECEIVED by the ENF office by March 31. That is not a mailing date, they must be received by that date.
For the first time, every lodge in the state had a registered ENF chair last year.
Remember, that the ENF chair must register every year. It is very simple to do at
Elks.org. If any lodge or lodge chair needs help they should contact the state or district chairs.
We discussed the chair challenge. Wisconsin is one of the leading states in country for participation and scores in the chair challenge. Sheboygan leads the state and the nation and Rice Lake is right behind. Reaching the chair challenge goal grants lodges an additional \$500 in the gratitude grant next lodge year. About half the lodges in the state are poised to get those funds. Get registered as lodge fundraising chair early and start working on chair challenge points as soon as April. s
Ryan Swantz spoke about converting the donor recognition board to an electronic format.
He will provide more details about that when he has it figured out in Watertown, but it would allow for a rapid update at low cost and increase visibility for donor recognition.









Meeting was called to order by Chair Mike Liebelt and opening ceremonies were conducted. Roll call on file. Site reports were given by members present. It was brought to the attention of those attending that the new VA facility, Milo C. Huempfner Outpatient Clinic in Green Bay has been approved. More information to follow regarding this.

Requests for funds were made by; Roman Baca, Wausau Clinic rep for \$1500 for misc. supplies and gift cards, Harvey Lewis, Beaver Dam Clinic for \$1500 for homeless veteran assistance, Tom Widzinski, Appleton Clinic for \$2500 for misc supplies and gift cards, Kay Buck, King Veterans Home rep for \$1500 to assist in making repairs, upgrades and supplies for the onsite bowling facility. These requests were approved totaling \$7000.

Our remaining WI ENVSC monies in the amount of \$5000 was discussed as to how to handle these funds. Two possible donations were discussed, one to donate to the VA VORP (Veterans Outreach Program) This has 11 Districts covering all Wi counties. They more or less focus on seeking veterans who need help, but are uncomfortable with asking for it. This can be for drug problems, PTSD, abuse, and a number of other situations. We also talked about the Dog2DTAGS program which we have donated to before. Chair Mike would check wit National ENVSC to see if we can donate to a VA facility. If we can the money could go there, and if not to the second choice. MMS&C to proceed with 6 yea and 1 nay, motion carried.

Open discussion: The need to get younger veterans and our female veterans into the VA system, this means having an up to date DD214 registered. Lodges could coordinate with County Veterans Service Office (CVSO) to have "sign up sessions where veterans could register for VA benefits. If they don't have a DD214, they could get help getting one. Also, helping veterans includes Hospice care, contact local facilities to check if you can help with patients who are veterans. Look into areas where you can impact veterans welfare.

Discussion closed and MMS&C to adjourn at 1100hrs.
