

Meeting Notes from Drug Awareness Committee Meeting

May 6, 2023

Committee Chair: Cristine Crum Attendance collected from roster

Meeting open at 10:05am with Pledge of Allegiance followed with introductions by all members and guests.

Special Presentation – Crime Stoppers:

Scott Sullivan from Chippewa Falls, Lodge No. 1326 presented Crime Stoppers, promoting awareness and value of the program within communities across Wisconsin. Where 911 call centers are used for emergencies, Crime Stoppers provides a forum for people to report criminal or suspicious behavior in a way that is accessible and anonymous. It generates tips to law enforcement agencies and promotes safer communities.

Highlighting that several communities have a Crime Stoppers program and many others do not. Elks are encouraged to get our local drug awareness programs involved with local Crime Stoppers.

Some of the highlights about the program that Scott presented:

Managed by a board that generally involves partnership with law enforcement, Faith based organizations, Health services and other Service organizations. Useful to have talent on the board involving: paralegal, social media skills, leadership in fundraising.

Chippewa Falls Crime Stoppers has had good success with over 200 tips in 18 months involving drugs, bank fraud, terrorism, human trafficking, among other crimes.

Some final points:

Application called P3Tips may be added to anyone's smart phone from the App Store. This allows anonymous tips with text and photos to be sent to Crime Stoppers directly from the phone.

Lodges are encouraged to consider including the tip-line phone number and other awareness of Crime Stoppers along with our Drug Awareness materials during local events.

DAP members may contact Cristine for a copy of Scott's presentation.

Narcan update:

Several lodges are installing Narcan boxes within their lodges. All lodges as well as local businesses (i.e. bars, etc.) are encouraged to consider these boxes as an opportunity for saving lives within their communities. Contact Meghan Vieth naloxzone@fammed.wisc.edu at Voices for Recovery for information for having these boxes installed.

Supplies:

Additional or special DAP supplies from what the committee gives each lodge can be ordered at choiceprinting.net/elks. Lodges will need to pay for these supplies.

The latest brochure samples were made available. Contact \hat{Cr} is time to order additional brochures or coloring books. Lodges can order up to 2 cases at a time.

What would DAP committee members like to take away from these meetings:

- 1. More information on Poster contest. Kathy Gillen will have details for the next poster contest and will share this with the committee later in the year. The contest indicates that kids who attend school are eligible, and it is not clear if this will include home schooled kids. Cristine will check into this and report back.
- a. Kathy provided the committee with a list of all winners from the 2022-2023 poster contest.
- 2. Continue sharing DAP best practices in lodges. What has been working.
- 3. Stigma training and awareness of impact to those susceptible to abuse. Cristine will target this topic for a future committee meeting.

Fundraising for DAP:

Find ways to raise funds in your lodges since local lodges generally are not able to fund DAP activities. Consider ideas such as meat raffles, special bake or craft sales. Look into WEA grants for special DAP events.

Reminder to all committee members:

Send reports of all DAP activities to Cristine.

Also report all hours of time spent on DAP activities to your lodge charitable report and copy Cristine.

Lodges are encouraged to use webinars from Dr. Heather and Ray Lozano in schools and community events.

Share in your lodges the drug take-back locations within your community.

All lodges are encourage to participate in the Enrique Camarena program. Contact Cristine for details.

Elks National Convention in Minneapolis has targeted DAP meeting on Tuesday where the Enrique Camarena award will be given to our Wisconsin recipient. Requesting good attendance and all Wisconsin lodges are encouraged to attend. This is also a good opportunity to hear messages from Ray Lozano.

the ENF, and the CIP Grants. SP Elect Karl Hanke laid out his goal for the state ENF
program for this coming year. He set a combined goal of \$110,000 for all to shoot for.
ENF Chairman Don reviewed last years accomplishments thanking everyone for
